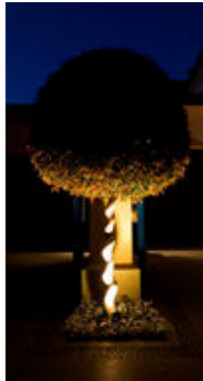

Gardens of the World

Gardens at Night was introduced to this magnificent home in Mawson Lakes, South Australia, during construction of rear and side gardens, the front garden had been completed. We met with owner on site, with his chosen landscaper, Frank Ross, of Exterior Concepts, to discuss this project in depth.

The major influence of this design – Gardens of the world...

Once commissioned to do the work Gardens at Night pre-wired all areas and immediately commenced installation of front garden lights.

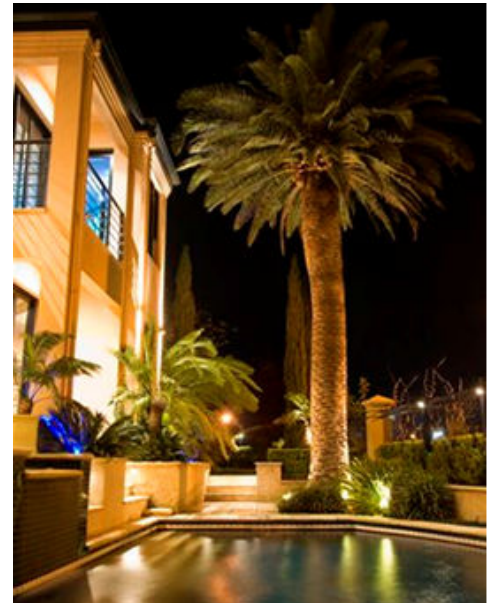
The front garden is very formal and structured and required lighting appropriate to the design, but at the same time it needed to be inviting, welcoming to guests, and with the addition of security features.

In this garden we used mostly up-lighting for front pillars, established trees and spiral conifers. Accompanied with some path lighting and down-lighting to create a lovely “moonlight effect”.

To conserve energy the lights were put on two switches with one switch being on a scanner to deter unwelcome guests.

Months later GAN returned to light the remainder area which used a number of our LED fittings, particularly the blue LED around the pool which complimented the matching blue tiles of the swimming pool. On the northern side of pool a number of established palm trees were installed which were up-lit and viewed from the dining balcony looked stunning both in the reflection of the swimming pool and the foreground, complimented by this is the magnificent view of the new Mawson Lakes development in the rear.

The gardens were completed when the Egyptian Courtyard was developed which included exotic statues, running water, and associated plantings. The majority of light used in this area, again was LED lighting and a feature was the combination of the Amber and Red LEDs placed in the water feature, used to accentuate the tones of the statues and stone used.
